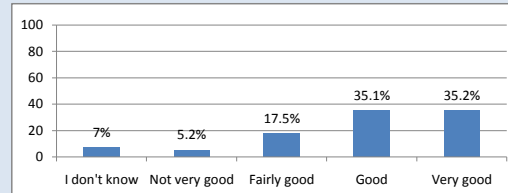
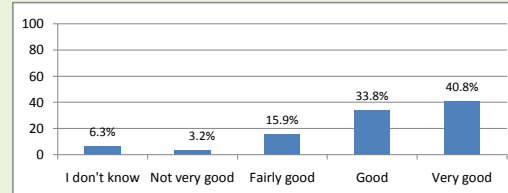


13. How would you rate yourself on making ends meet?
